With spring coming and the weather starting to warm up everyone is thinking about how to improve their golf game. A great place to start is the short game! Putting is the most crucial part of putting together a good round of golf. Here are a couple drills to help knock off the rust and knock a few strokes off of your next round.

Amateur Side Drill

We've all watched golf on tv and heard announcers say "he missed that one on the amateur side." What they mean by this is the player missed the putt on the low side of the hole. A putt that breaks right to left that you miss on the left side of the hole would be missing on the low side. A putt that misses low never has a chance to go in, much like a putt that is left short of the hole. This drill helps you get putts rolling on the high side of the hole and giving them a chance to go in. Simply pick a breaking putt, either right to left or left to right and place a tee in front of the lower third part of the hole. This "blocker" will not allow putts to go in that are tracking on the low side of the hole. This will teach you to consistently keep putts rolling on the high side of the hole giving them a better chance to go in.

10-15-20 Drill

This drill is simple and effective. Simply place a club roughly two feet beyond the hole you are putting at then put tees down at 10 feet, 15 feet, and 20 feet from the hole. Grab five balls and go to the 10 foot tee. The goal is to get four out of the five balls either in the hole or between the hole and the club behind the hole. Once you have done this move back to the 15 foot tee and repeat the drill and then on to the 20 foot tee. This drill teaches you proper speed control that will get the ball to the hole giving it a chance to go in but also leaving you an easy next putt if you happen to miss.

I hope this helps knock off some of your winter rust, if you have questions feel free to ask Derek!

The new three tee box is finished and seeded, 8 red tee will be completed if we don't use the soil as backfill for the bridges. The bridges are here and will be set into place as soon as soil conditions allow. After that retaining walls will be built and backfilled. Then concrete will be used to deck the bridges and pour the paths. Estimated completion will be the end of April.

- No sunflower seeds
- Dispose of cigarettes and cigars
- Properly repair ballmarks
- Fill divots with sand and seed
- Pick up broken tees
- Observe cart rules
- Cart Path only on 2,6,9-17
- Keep carts out of native areas
